

ENA Care Group Statement - Modern Slavery Act 2015

The Modern Slavery Act 2015 states that every organisation providing goods and services in the UK with a total global annual turnover of £36m or more will be required to produce a slavery and human trafficking statement for each financial year.

ENA CARE GROUP LIMITED is below the annual turnover figure of £36m or more, therefore do not meet the requirements of the above act, we choose to voluntarily produce a "slavery and human trafficking statement".

It is unlikely that ENA CARE GROUP LIMITED will experience cases of slavery or human trafficking, but these statement details the commitment to raise awareness and defines a process to address issues if they do arise.

We have a zero-tolerance view to modern slavery. We aim to act in an ethical manner with integrity throughout our business operations.

All staff will be made aware of the issues surrounding slavery and human trafficking and encouraged and supported to report any concerns to the management of ENA CARE GROUP LIMITED.

ENA CARE GROUP LIMITED will be open and transparent with all staff and encourage discussion about slavery and human trafficking. The service will also support any staff that may be subject to slavery or human trafficking.

In situations of slavery or human trafficking being identified, ENA CARE GROUP LIMITED will share this information with the appropriate authorities with the objective of preventing future situations arising, and to promote the elimination of routes and sources of slavery or human trafficking.

This statement applies to all subsidiaries of ENA CARE GROUP LIMITED, including EUROPEAN NURSING AGENCY LIMITED and ENA HOURLY CARE LIMITED.
